## CALL FOR THE ONE HUNDRED FOURTH ANNUAL CONVENTION AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY Department of Minnesota

The 104<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Minnesota, is hereby called to be held in Willmar, Minnesota July 11, 12 and 13, 2024, for the purpose of:

- 1. Electing Department Officers
- 2. Considering any amendments which may be proposed for Unit, District, and Department Constitutions
- 3. Electing delegates and alternates to the 105<sup>th</sup> National Convention.
- 4. Receiving reports of Department Officers, National Committeewoman, District Presidents, and Chairmen of Department Committees.
- 5. The transaction of such other business as may be brought before the Convention in conformity with the provisions of the National and Department Constitutions.

\*

REPRESENTATION: (Article VI, Unit Bylaws) "Each Unit shall be entitled to two delegates at the Department Convention one of whom shall be the Unit President, plus one additional delegate for each 50 members or major fraction thereof whose dues have been received by the Department Treasurer 30 days prior to the meeting of the Convention for which they are elected. Each Unit shall elect its delegates. In addition, each Unit shall elect alternate delegates to serve in the absence of delegates. The delegates shall serve in the order elected before any alternate delegates and then the alternate delegates shall serve in the order elected." (Example: Units which have membership of 10 to 25 are entitled to 2 delegates, Membership of 26 to 75, 3 delegates; 76 to 125, 4 delegates, etc.)

The vote of each Unit shall be equal to the total number of delegates to which the Unit is entitled, provided there is a delegate from the Unit present to cast the vote. Alternates will have power to vote only in the absence of the delegate.

"To be eligible to candidacy for office or delegate to convention, a member must be a member in good standing." (Article VIII, Unit Bylaws.)

<u>EXPENSES</u>: The Convention expenses of Unit delegates must be borne by their Unit or by the delegates themselves unless they are Department Chairmen or members of the Department Committees,

<u>CREDENTIALS</u>: Two (2) delegate and two (2) alternate cards are included in this mailing. Additional cards will be available for pick up at the Department Convention. The outgoing Unit President is the Chairman of your Unit's delegation. If she will not be attending the delegation she should elect a chairman of the delegation. It is best to have this done before the delegates leave home.

<u>ELECTION OF DELEGATES</u>: All delegates and alternates shall be elected at a regular Unit meeting or at a special meeting <u>called for that purpose</u>.



I was so honored to present certificates and our Unit's prizes to the winners in front of their classroom. Americanism will be front and center at American Legion Auxiliary Minnesota Girls State in less than a month. Each morning, the colors of our Nation are advanced, the Pledge of Allegiance is recited, the National Anthem is song, and an Americanism reading, or flag etiquette is presented in some way. The colors are retired each evening or at the end of a session. The ALA MN Girl State citizens are asked on the first and last evening "What is Americanism?" It is very interesting to hear their answers.

Flag Day is June 14<sup>th</sup>. Flag Day is celebrated on June 14 in the United States. It commemorates the adoption of the <u>flag of the United States</u> on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the <u>Second Continental Congress</u>. The Flag Resolution stated "That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation." The week of June 14 (June 09–15, 2024) is designated as "National Flag Week." During National Flag Week, the president will issue a proclamation "urging the people to observe the day as the anniversary of the adoption on June 14, 1777, by the Continental Congress of the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States of America." Father's Day is on June 16<sup>th</sup>. Father's Day in the United States is on the third Sunday of June. It honors all fathers, grandfathers, great-grandfathers, and father figures for their contribution in the lives of their children. #### **Minnesota National Guard Youth and Teen Camp**

Camp Ripley, MN

Week 1: July 21-27 and Week 2: July 28-August 3

#### OUR HISTORY

Approximately 300 youth, ages 10-15, converge on Camp Ripley, Minnesota, in July-August to attend the Annual Minnesota National Guard Youth Camp. During the one-week camp session, the youth, dependents, nieces, nephews, brothers, sisters, and grandchildren of current and retired Minnesota Guard members spend seven days experiencing Camp Ripley and its surrounding environment.

A group of Minnesota National Guard members first discussed establishing a youth education program in the summer of 1988. In September 1989, the Adjutant General, Major General Eugene Andreotti, appointed the Family Program Manager to establish a youth camp program. A State Coordinator was appointed in November, and the first planning meeting was held in December 1989. In August 1991, 104 youths attended the First Annual Minnesota National Guard Youth Camp, which was a resounding success.

Since then, the Youth Camp Program has developed into a Minnesota non-profit organization. The Internal Revenue Service recognizes it as a non-profit organization, and a Board of Directors oversees the planning and conduct of all operations. It solicits, screens, and trains volunteers who serve as the staff for all youth camp activities. All volunteers are active, retired, spouses, or dependents of members of Army or Air National Guard members. In October 1992, the American Camping Association (ACA), after undergoing a thorough investigation during the 1992 camp session, classified Youth Camp as an accredited camp. Youth Camp was the first accredited National Guard Youth Camp in the United States. Youth Camp continues through the re-accreditation process and remains an ACA camp.

In 2001, Teen Camp was created. This one-week camp was developed for 13 to 15-year-olds. It intends to promote respect, friendship, leadership, teamwork, self-confidence, self-esteem, and community involvement.

#### The purpose of the Minnesota National Guard Youth Camp is to:

- Provide a unique and enjoyable opportunity for the Minnesota National Guard dependents to explore the environment in which they live and be more responsible in maintaining the environment for future generations.
- Provide a positive experience in a safe and caring environment.
- Assist youth in understanding why their Guard member serves in the National Guard.
- Help youth cope with the stress and confusion of separation/deployment.

#### **VOLUNTEER POSITIONS**

There are many volunteer opportunities at both Youth and Teen Camp for persons 18 and older! This camp will change you life in so many amazing ways. Please consider being a part of the camp.

Indicate which position you would like to apply for on your Adult Youth Camp Application. Although requests for certain positions are considered when staffing camp, assignments are made based on the best interests of that week's camp operations.

Listed below are the different volunteer positions and requirements for those positions.

#### Leaders / Counselors

#### Youth Camp Counselors: Must be 18 years or older and will spend the week at Youth Camp participating as counselors for 10-12 year old campers. Counselors must be motivated, energetic, patient people who are expected to lead the campers in various activities.

Teen Camp Counselor: Must be 20 years or older and will spend the week at Teen Camp participating as counselors for 13-15 year old campers. Counselors must be motivated, energetic, patient people who are expected to lead the campers in various activities.

#### Waterfront

Waterfront Staff: Acts as a member of the waterfront staff assisting in direction of waterfront activities to include swimming, canoeing and all other water activities. Typically is a member of the Biking Staff for morning activities.

#### **Biking**

Biking Staff: Acts as a member of the biking Campout staff assisting in biking activities to include bike trip and other biking activities. Typically is a member of the Waterfront Staff for afternoon activities.

#### Orienteering.

Orienteering Staff: Assists with orienteering activities, exposing campers to compass usage and map navigation. Typically is a member of the Confidence Course Staff for afternoon activities.

#### Range

Rifle Range Staff: Assists with rifle range

#### Medical

**Medical Volunteers:** Volunteers with current licenses as doctors, nurses, emergency medical technicians or paramedics. Medical personnel are assigned to teams and serve as counselors either at Youth or Teen camp throughout the week, while also attending to the medical needs of the campers on their team.

#### Drivers

Vehicle/Bus Drivers: Must be a current military member licensed on 44 passenger bus or have a current commercial bus driver license. Drivers will serve as counselors for either Youth or Teen camp providing team transportation to their scheduled activities.

#### Security

Night Security Staff: Are responsible for ensuring campers are safe during the night and provide any assistance to campers as needed. (This person is working during the night.)

Overnight Campout Staff: Assists with all activities during the campout at Bennett Hill to include meal preparation, water delivery, campfire building, and night security during the campout. This person is working during the night.

#### **Arts & Crafts**

Arts and Crafts Lead: Is responsible for all arts and crafts activities to include assisting campers with their projects, setup and teardown of the craft room and organizing of team craft boxes. Supervises all Arts and Crafts Staff.

- activities, familiarizing campers with range procedures and firing of 22 caliber rifles. Typically is a member of the Archery Staff for afternoon activities.
- Archery Range Staff: Assists with all archery range activities to include range operations and equipment maintenance and bow usage. Instructs campers on the safe usage of archery equipment and how to site a bow and arrow.

#### Administration

- Administration Personnel: Are responsible for the administrative processing of all campers and staff, answering phones, mail delivery, processing camper memory book and support of camp director and camp.
- Supply Lead: Is responsible for all accountability of, buildings, vehicles and equipment borrowed from Camp Ripley. Directs and oversees all pre-camp setup and turn in of buildings and equipment. Should have good working knowledge of Camp Ripley procedures and personnel. Supervises all Supply/Logistics Staff. (This position is appointed by the MN National Guard Youth Camp Board).
- Supply Staff: Assists Supply Director with all accountability, setup and turn in of all buildings and equipment as well as operations during camp.

 Arts and Crafts Staff: Assists with all arts and crafts activities to include assisting campers with their projects, setup and teardown of the craft room and organizing of team craft boxes.

#### **Confidence Course**

- Confidence Course Lead: Is responsible for inspection operation and direction of all activities at the confidence course where campers go through a series of obstacles that encourage teamwork and participating in new experiences. Supervises all Confidence Course Staff.
- Confidence Course Staff: Assists with confidence course activities where campers go through a series of obstacles that encourage teamwork and participating in new experiences. Typically is a member of the Orienteering Staff for morning activities.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

To come to camp, applicants must meet a few criteria;

- 1. All campers must be the child, grandchild, niece, nephew, brother, or sister of a current or retired member of the MN National Guard.
- 2. Campers must be between the ages of 10-15 by the start of camp.
- 3. All volunteers must be the spouse, parent (including in-laws), sibling (including in-laws), child, or grandchild of a current or retired member of the Minnesota National Guard.
- 4. Eligibility requirements may only be waived by the Board of Directors and are considered on a case-by-case basis. Please email us for consideration.

# Department of Minnesota June 2024 Unit Mailing Community Service



## June 2024 Unit Mailing Girl's State

Since this is my last unit mailing as your Girls State Program Chairman, first I'd like to thank Sharon for this appointment. I was definitely apprehensive about this chairmanship, but like every year since my first Department Chairmanship, I have learned SO much about this program, our units, and how everything works.

This committee has worked diligently for the past eight months to create an educational and fun week, while providing a safe environment for our students. Our Education Director (Bethany Dickert) has our program ready. Our Americanism Chairman (Mary Kuperus) has several events to show patriotism for the group such as folding of the flag and flag retirement. Our Director (Patti Coleman) has held monthly zoom training meetings so our entire staff can be prepared. Lynn Carr, Yolanda Dailey and I round out our committee and the support from these five Auxiliary members has been outstanding.

New this year: we are going to have "Auxiliary Minutes" – short two minutes daily presentations about some of our Auxiliary programs such as poppies and scholarships.

Although this is my last unit mailing, I have one more project in mind (after Girls State week). I plan to create a "timeline" for units to use in the future. Yes, each year's committee will make changes — we learn from our staff and our citizens how we can improve the week. I hope to have a "go-to" place to answer some of questions the Department Office and I have fielded this year. I ask that you check the timeline on our website (<a href="www.mnala.org">www.mnala.org</a>) first. If you don't find the answer, contact next year's Program Chairman. It is the chairman's job to work with the units. If she doesn't have the answer, she will find it. I hope to provide suggestions for your unit. Check it out in a couple months and let me know if I need to address your suggestion on the timeline.

This program is one that each unit should have on its mind as we progress through our year. Early on, we should be budgeting to send youth to this week in June. Going forward we should ask ourselves: How can we fundraise? As school starts, how can we educate our junior girls as to what this program can provide them? After the letters go out to the schools, can we contact school staff for access to the junior girls? Can we invite last year's girls to attend one of our meetings and again, ask your local paper to cover? Can we invite students and parents in for an informational meeting? My one comment is that you can't ever start too early.

The last thing that I would encourage your unit to do is to complete the Annual Report for Girls State. This is another way for this committee to learn and improve. I was actually the 3<sup>rd</sup> District Girls State Chairman, too, and I received reports from less than half of our units. After making several contacts with the District Presidents, I received reports from most districts. I know that 3<sup>rd</sup> District was not the only one that didn't hear from a large percentage of their units.

#### SOME GUIDELINES & IDEAS FOR WHERE TO USE YOUR POPPY FUNDS

I hope that each of your Units had a successful Poppy distribution day. Units can decide where they want their Poppy Funds to be used as long as they follow national Poppy guidelines.

Funds derived from poppies are restricted by action of The American Legion national organization who sets all poppy requirements. Poppy funds must be used only for the welfare of veterans and their families and active-duty military and their families when a financial or medical necessity exists. A good rule of thumb would be to determine if the use is a WANT or a NEED. Poppy funds are used when there is a NEED, not a WANT!

In Minnesota, each unit can decide how they want to use their Poppy funds, as long as it complies with the national Poppy guidelines which are:

- The rehabilitation of veterans honorably discharged from the United States Armed Forces after April 6, 1917.
- The welfare of the families of veterans of the above-named period.
- The rehabilitation of hospitalized military service personnel returning home and awaiting discharge who require treatment in service hospitals.
- The welfare of veterans, active military personnel, and the families of veterans and active military personnel of the above-named period where financial and medical need is evident.
- For the purpose of poppy kits and supplies used to make symbolic poppies and poppy items that will be distributed for donations to the Poppy Fund.

When reference is made to "veterans and their family," it means immediate family and dependents. Immediate family consists of wife, husband, daughter, and son who live with the veteran. Remember: Poppy Funds are to help veterans and their families and active-duty military and their families where financial and medical need is evident. If the veteran is deceased, then Poppy Funds cannot be used for his/her family. Poppy money cannot be used for a family member who does not live with the veteran.

Each fall, our Department sends out a "green" sheet listing the donations that the Department Executive Committee has approved for solicitation. There are multiple items on that list and many of them are ways that your unit can use your poppy funds. Some of those items include: \$5.00 Bill Shower – ALA Hospital Program – Gift Shop – Department Scholarship Fund – Past President's Parley Health Care Scholarship Fund – Armed Forces Service Center – Temporary Financial Assistance. Please seriously consider earmarking some of your poppy funds for those programs that aid veterans across the state.

Poppy funds can also be used for the programs and activities that your unit may support in your local community like activities and programs in local nursing homes, Stand Down, activities and treats at your local VA Medical Centers and Minnesota Veterans Homes. This includes purchasing clothing, sewing items like bibs, making quilts, providing comfort items, games, canteen books or cash offered at activities, and refreshments, etc. at any of those facilities. Units may also donate funds to either their local or the national Veterans Creative Arts Festival through various forms of art therapy. Many of our Department and District Projects can also receive poppy funds. If you are in doubt, please feel free to ask.

Our National organization has three other missions that our poppy donations may be used for. Detailed information can be found on the ALA national website.

These programs are:

- Honor Flight Inc.
- The National Veterans Creative Arts Festival, which the Auxiliary has co-presented for over 20 years
- Food insecurity among service members nationwide

#### **Poppy Funds CANNOT be used for:**

- 1. Any general operating fund of a department, unit, or post.
- 2. Any community service project that does not strictly benefit the welfare of an individual veteran/military servicemember or the welfare of his/her family. American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Program Guide

- 3. General maintenance, beautification, or improvement projects of American Legion or Auxiliary facilities, including adding ramp(s) to a post home.
- 4. Investments, even those that would bring profit to the unit or post.
- 5. POW/MIA programs.
- 6. Memberships, including other veteran support organizations such as Gold Star Mothers.
- 7. Contributions to, or payouts from, the Auxiliary Emergency Fund.
- 8. ALA Girls State/ALA Girls Nation fees.
- 9. Flags or flagpoles.
- 10. Scholarships which do not restrict eligibility solely to military service members or their children, or where financial need is not evident.
- 11. Mileage, travel, or lodging expenses; registration of conference fees; or costs incurred by a person including ALA members, volunteers, and staff to attend any meeting, conference or event, even if it is about veterans, military, or any other topic.
- 12. Attire or uniforms used by volunteers or staff in promoting or conducting ALA program activity or business.

Use of Poppy Funds is allowable for care packages only when it is for a welfare need (such as first aid topical treatment or vital hygiene items), as opposed to a comfort need, and not comfort/leisure items (such as baked goods or books).

A Poppy Donation Container that was created by one of your unit members and used when your unit distributed poppies. Again, be creative.

Contests are open to all Auxiliary members. You do need to have a poppy of some sort in your entry, but you do not have to use the ALA poppy. All entries must include an attached sealed envelope with a card inside that states your name, unit number and unit location. If using ALA poppies, remember to remove the white tags. Small or large poppies may be used.

Voting for the People's Choice will be by donation, with the funds going to the Department President's Special Project of purchasing a player piano for the Minnesota Veterans Home in Bemidji and funds for activities at the Veterans Homes in Preston and Montevideo.

#### **Memorial Day History**

Memorial Day began after the Civil War with both formal and informal ceremonies at graves and ceremonies for the soldiers who had fallen in battle. Many places claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day in 1866, including Waterloo, New York, and Macon and Columbus, Georgia. On May 5, 1868, the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR), a Union veterans organization, established Decoration Day, May 30, as a time for the nation to decorate the dead with flowers. Arlington National Cemetery held the first large observance later that year.

By the end of the 19th century, Memorial Day ceremonies were held throughout the country on May 30. The Army and Navy adopted policies for proper observances, and state legislatures passed proclamations designating the day. After World War I, the day was expanded to honor those who died in all American wars, and in 1971, Memorial Day was declared a national holiday to be celebrated on the last Monday in May.

#### Memorial Day vs. Veterans Day

What is the difference between Veterans Day and Memorial Day?

Memorial Day is meant for remembering and honoring military personnel who died in the service of their country, particularly those who died in battle or as a result of a wound sustained in battle.

<u>Veterans Day</u> is intended to thank all those who have honorably served in the military – in wartime or peacetime.

#### **Memorial Day Facts**

- Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day.
- The birthplace of Memorial Day is a debated topic. Cities such as Warrington, Virginia; Gettysburg, Pennsylvania; Savannah, Georgia; and Waterloo, New York, are some places believed to be its birthplace.
- Memorial Day was originally celebrated May 30 until the Uniform Monday Holiday Act took effect in 1971 and it was moved to the final Monday in May.
- 1971 is also when Memorial Day became an official holiday.
- Originally, only soldiers who had died in the Civil War were honored.
- The National Monument of Remembrance Act passed in 2000 requires all Americans to stop what they are doing at 3:00 pm on Memorial Day for a minute of silence to remember and honor those who died while in service.
- The Poem "Bivouac of the Dead" is often recited on Memorial Day and inscribed on iron tablets throughout many of the country's national cemeteries, including the original entrance to Arlington National Cemetery. The poem was written by Theodore O'Hara to honor his fellow soldiers from Kentucky who died in the Mexican-American War. Bivouac (/ˈbivooˌak/) is a temporary camp without tents or cover.

We received 20 Children of Warriors applications, four (4) Spirit of Youth applications and five (5) Non-Traditional Student. They all are very qualified, and each wrote a wonderful essay and even brought me to tears a couple of times, which made the decision on who to forward very difficult. Of the three I sent in we had two scholarships awarded.

Spirit of Youth Scholarship gave out \$5,000 winner per Division and a \$1,000 winner per state.




