TOPIC #2 – What is a Preamble and Why do we recite it?

PREAMBLE TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY

For God and Country, we associate ourselves together for the following purposes: To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America; to maintain law and order; to foster and perpetuate a one hundred percent Americanism; to preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in all wars; to inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state, and nation; to combat the autocracy of both the classes and the masses; to make right the master of might; to

promote peace and goodwill on Earth; to safeguard and transmit to posterity, the principles of justice, freedom, and democracy; to participate in and contribute to the accomplishment of the aims and purposes of The American Legion; to consecrate and sanctify our association by our devotion to mutual helpfulness.

What is a Preamble?

The Preamble is a preliminary or preparatory statement; an introduction; the introductory part of a statute or deed, stating its purpose, aims, and justification.

The Preamble explains the objectives of the Constitution in two ways: first, about the structure of the governance and second, about the ideals the organization wishes to achieve.

When The American Legion began, its members got together and created a preamble to their constitution. It was a compass for these veterans pointing to the direction of where they wanted their organization to go. A few years later, The American Legion decided that it would be a great idea to include spouses and children of their members and their comrades who were no longer with them in their journey. And the American Legion Auxiliary was born. The ALA decided to use the basics of The American Legion Preamble and change a few words to show that it was a preamble for the descendants of the members of The American Legion.

Why Do We Recite the Preamble?

Members of The American Legion family are known to recite their respective Preambles at the beginning of every meeting. This is their affirmation that we join together for God and our Country and for the purposes of the American Legion Auxiliary.

Upholding the Constitution: The ALA's first obligation is to uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America

Maintaining law and order: The ALA believes that law and order must be maintained to preserve freedom

Promoting Americanism: The ALA works to foster and continue to "perpetuate

or continue forever to promote and practice Americanism

Preserving memories: The ALA preserves the memories of veterans and their associations in war

Promoting peace and goodwill: The ALA promotes peace and goodwill on earth

Safeguarding principles: The ALA safeguards and believes in the principles of justice, freedom, and democracy

Mutual helpfulness: The ALA consecrates and joins together to be mutually helpful to all

Supporting The American Legion: The ALA supports The American Legion and participates in its aims and purposes.

The next time you join in with your members in reciting the Preamble, think about what it really means...it's not just a bunch of random words. It is our purpose.

It is my hope that all our Units are working diligently on our program "Give 10 to Education!" There are so many ways you can participate in this program even if your Unit is small and you don't have a lot of finances. You can volunteer your time in the reading or mentoring programs, or perhaps the school may have other things that need to be done. Just ask. This is such a fun program to be involved in. Here is a little tidbit I want to share with you. In my Community we have the Yellow Ribbon Citizen's Committee and this group asks our local Dollar Store if they would be willing to donate school supplies to our

The Education Program promotes the American Legion Auxiliary's role in providing quality education for children and adults through classroom activities, literacy programs, scholarship promotion and support of education beyond high school, with special emphasis on children of veterans and service members.

There are many ways that we can support the children of our Veterans. Let's start with American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary Scholarships. National Scholarships snapshot: www.alaforveterans.org/scholarships for applications.

All American Legion Auxiliary scholarships should be submitted by March 1st to a local American Legion Auxiliary Unit, the application must be signed by the Unit President.

1. Spirit of Youth Scholarship for Junior Members

- a. One (1) Junior member in each of the five (5) divisions will receive a \$5,000 scholarship.
- b. Applicant must have been a Junior member for the past three (3) years and hold a current membership card and must continue their membership in the American Legion Auxiliary during scholarship period.
- c. Must be in their senior year of high school. This is a scholarship to attend an accredited institution of higher education. They must be of good character and have grades that meet the entrance requirements at the institution of their choice and must have at least a 3.0 GPA using a 4.0 scale.
- d. Application must be received by the Local American Legion Auxiliary Unit President on or before March 1st, 2025.
- e. The Decision of the Judges Shall Be Final.

2. The Non-Traditional Student Scholarship

- a. One (1) scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 will be awarded in each of the five (5) divisions.
- b. Applicants must be:
 - i. A current member of the American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary or Sons of The American Legion, must have held membership for two (2) preceding years and for the current (2025) membership year.
 - ii. A Non-Traditional student returning to the classroom after some period in which

their formal education was interrupted, or a student beginning their education at a later point in life.

- c. American Legion Auxiliary Spirit of Youth Scholarship recipients are not eligible.
- d. Application must be received by the Local American Legion Auxiliary Unit President on or before March 1st, 2025.
- e. The Decision of the Judges Shall Be Final.

3. Junior Member Loyalty Scholarship

- a. Two (2) scholarships of \$2,500 each will be awarded in each of the five (5) divisions.
- b. Candidates for this award shall have been a Junior member and held membership in the American Legion Auxiliary for the past three (3) consecutive years (2022, 2023 and 2024) and be a paid member for the current year (2025). They must continue their membership during the scholarship period.
- c. This scholarship is intended for the traditional college student with no interruption in education, who is at least in the first semester of college or technical school but has not yet attained a bachelor's degree.
- d. This is a scholarship to attend an accredited institution of higher education for the completion of a bachelor's degree. Applicants must have completed at least one semester with the grades that meet continuation requirements at the institution of their choice and must have at least a 3.0 GPA using a 4.0 scale.
- e. Previous American Legion Auxiliary national scholarship recipients are welcome to apply.
- f. Applicants must present the completed application, along with the other required material.
- g. Application must be received by the Local American Legion Auxiliary Unit President on or before March 1st, 2025.
- h. The Decision of the Judges Shall Be Final.

4. Department of Minnesota Scholarship

- a. Awarded to deserving sons or daughters, grandsons or granddaughters of a veteran who need financial assistance.
- b. Applicant must resident in the State of Minnesota or a member of the American Legion Auxiliary, the American Legion or Sons of the American Legion.
- c. A high school senior/graduate or college student/graduate, seeking further education with a scholastic record and average of least a "C."
- d. Applications can be found on http://www.mnala.org/scholarships.
- e. Application must be received by the Local American Legion Auxiliary Unit President on or before March 1st, 2025.
- f. The Decision of the Judges Shall Be Final.
- g. This scholarship is totally funded by the Department of Minnesota American Legion Auxiliary.

5. Children of Warriors National Presidents Scholarship

- a. Awarded to the children of veterans who served in the armed forces during eligibility dates for the American Legion.
- b. Applicants must be in their senior year of high school.
- c. Three (3) scholarships of \$5,000 will be awarded in each division.
- d. Applicants must complete 50 hours of community service.
- e. Application is due by March 1st, 2025, to national via online submission. You can print

forms and rules at www.alaforveterans.org/scholarships/children-of-warriors.com.

National office will forward applications to departments.

f. The decision of Judges shall be final.

6. Department of Minnesota Past Presidents Parley Health Care Scholarship

- a. The Past Presidents Parley Health Care Scholarship has been established to assist needy and deserving students or adults to commence or further their education in any phase of the health care field.
- b. One year \$1,000 scholarship
- c. Applicant must be a member of the American Legion Auxiliary for a minimum of three (3) years and maintain a "C" or better average in school if a student.
- d. Applications must be signed by the Unit President of which you are a member due to Unit President by March 1st, 2025.

The American Legion Legacy Scholarship

Provides college scholarship money to children of post 9/11 veterans who have died or have a combined VA disability rating of 50% or more. The application period for the 2025 Legacy Scholarship will open on January 1st, 2025. You can find more information at https://www.legion.org/scholarships/legacy.

The American Legion Oratorical Contest

High school students are eligible to compete, competition begins at the local Post level and advances to a state champion, then on to National level. More information can be found at www.legion.org.

- Unit Must sign all applications. This signature should be done after the applicant has completed the application. It is up to the Unit to verify that all rules have been followed and all requirements are in place.
- Units are in control of their own scholarships; it is important to publicize your scholarships.

HISTORY

What is History? History is all the events in a certain era of time. It is what is documented and retained for future generations.

Who makes history? We make history for the American Legion Auxiliary in everything we do on behalf of the organization in our Units, the District and our Department.

Why record history? We record history for the benefit of others who will succeed us in our efforts of "service not self" for veterans, active military, our communities and the children & youth of tomorrow.

How do I record history? That part is up to you! Many use the written word or photos. Social media posts are becoming very popular in recording history and are very helpful to chronologically recall events and activities. Video recordings of interviews are popular as well. Do not include personal opinions. Only the occasion, the people involved and what occurred.

Should the Junior Auxiliary record History? Absolutely! What our junior members do to learn about our programs and volunteering is just as important to record as what we do as senior members. Young people do marvelous things!

As your Department Historian this year, I would like to highlight some of the members who have made history in the Minnesota American Legion Auxiliary. It is my hope that members read and learn from what I share and share it with others. This is our Why!



Dr. Helen Hielscher was one of the first female surgeons in Minnesota, and helped develop the ALA's veterans' hospitalization and rehabilitation mission component. She played a significant role in successfully encouraging the U.S. Veterans Bureau to offer more help, such as maintaining medical facilities to care for veterans and starting programs for giving veterans interest-free loans to start farms as their livelihoods. While she didn't hold a national office within the Auxiliary, Hielscher was elected as chairman of the first National Convention in 1921, since the organization did not have a national president yet.


